The significance of the gifts:

- Gold: Jesus is the KING.
- Frankincense: Jesus is the HIGH PRIEST.
- Myrrh: Jesus is the SACRIFICE.

The gift of gold: Jesus is the KING.

Three Responses to King Jesus:

1. Herod <u>OPPOSED</u> Jesus as king.

When Herod the king heard this, he was troubled, and all Jerusalem with him; and assembling all the chief priests and scribes of the people, he inquired of them where the Christ was to be born. They told him, "In Bethlehem of Judea, for so it is written by the prophet..."
