Big Idea: Jesus came to <u>serve</u>; He invites his followers <u>to do the same</u>.

1. Jesus washed His followers feet to display both <u>a posture</u> and <u>a purpose</u> that He wanted them to <u>embrace</u>.

"So Jesus called the followers together. He said, "You know that the rulers of the non-Jewish people love to show their power over the people. And their important leaders love to use all their authority over the people. But it should not be that way with you. Whoever wants to be your leader must be your servant. Whoever wants to be first must serve the rest of you like a slave. Do as I did: The Son of Man did not come for people to serve him. He came to serve others and to give his life to save many people."

2. Embracing the posture of a servant helps me surrender the desire for personal <u>power</u>, <u>position</u>, <u>and recognition</u>.
