Exodus 16:2-4 (NIV)

- We ask <u>RAW</u> prayers because God is a <u>FRIEND</u>.
- We ask **CONCRETE** prayers because God is a **PROVIDER**.
- We ask <u>BOLD</u> prayers because God is a <u>GUIDE</u>.
