- The church is not an audience; but an <u>army</u>. (<u>Ephesians 6:10-18</u>)
- The church is not consumers; but **contributors**. (Philippians 2:4)

- **Grow**. (Discipleship)
- **Group**. (Fellowship)
- **Give**. (Ministry)
- **Go**. (Evangelism)
